## Mini Demonstrations

### April Program



Put your glasses on, sharpen your pencils and bring your phone for photos or videos! It is demonstration time and we have a nice variety of techniques to share with you.

Five stations will be arranged around the room for you to get up close and personal, learn and ask questions.

Station: Perfect Circles: Marsha Walper will show you two methods to make perfectly smooth, round circles for hand applique. You will be amazed how easy these techniques are.

Station: Folded Flower: Linda O'Sullivan will demonstrate how to create a folded flower beginning with a variety of shapes: hexagon, pentagon, circle and triangle.

Station: Batting Selection: The right batting makes a difference! Mona Snowden will explain the myriad of batting terms and which product to choose based on your quilting style and project. Each participant will see, touch and feel 16 different batting samples.

Station: Flying Geese: Wendy Stone will demonstrate two easy methods to create a flying geese unit. Both methods are easy and will result in faster creation and uniform units for your quilts.

Station: Hexagons with English Paper Piecing: Karen Kunz will show you her organized method and share easy tips for creating hexagons with the English paper piecing method.

## Philanthropic Challenge

**You are the Cat's MEOW!** Thank you for your generous donations of 14 cat quilts that will be shared between Treats, Inc. and It's Meow Or Never. Beds are always needed so if you missed making one, please bring to a future meeting and pass on to Roberta Granville. Specifications for Cat Beds: Machine piece and quilt using only good quality cotton fabric. No flannel or fuzzy fabrics as this is harmful to cats. Recommended sizes: 22" X 30" and 29" X 32.5."

**By July!** Grab a friend and consider making:

**Lap quilts for veterans:** confined to wheelchairs, to wounded service members in hospitals and to retirees in convalescent and retirement homes. Suggested sizes: 30" x 30", 34" x 40" inches, and 45" x 60." The smaller sizes are so they can be used in wheelchairs without causing problems. You could also include a pocket for incidentals like eyeglasses, keys, or coins, but that is optional. A hanging sleeve on the back is another option if the recipient would like to hang the quilt on the wall. All colors and designs are fine but a patriotic theme is particularly appreciated. Although there are some female veterans, most of the recipients will be men. We are aiming for 100 lap quilts! Ladies we can DO this.

**Quilts of Valor:** The mission of the Quilts of Valor (QOV) Foundation is to cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing quilts. Refer to <http://www.qovf.org/quilters-questions/> for specific requirements and instructions for making a QOV. QU usually displays those completed during the summer guild meeting. Questions? # 36th Annual Capital City Quilt Show aka The Museum Quilt Show

## Dates to remember

**Entry deadline:** Midnight, Thursday July 12, 2018

**Quilt turn-in event:** Saturday, August 18, 2018, 10 am to 12 Noon

**Quilt show Pre-opening reception:** Thursday, August 30, 2018, 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm

**Quilt show opens:** Friday, August 31, 2018

**Quilt show closes:** October 28, 2018

**Quilt pick-up:** Saturday, November 3, 2018, 10 am to 12 Noon

The Online Entry system is up, running, and entries are coming in. Just a reminder – you must respond to every item on the entry or the SUBMIT button will not appear. If you are making an entry and do not see the SUBMIT button, go back and review your entry making sure you have responded to every item.

Entry is open to ALL members of Tallahassee Quilters Unlimited. We do not have a Show judge, so there are no Quilt Police commenting on your entry. Viewers make the choice for winners.

Check your calendars for Show dates and sign up for a volunteer time to work at the show. We request everyone entering a quilt sign up for at least one two-hour shift. Depending on the day of the week and time of day for which you volunteer, you'll also have the opportunity to work on your hand sewing/quilting project or catch up on that novel your reading. OR you could be really busy with many visitors to the museum answering their quilt questions, selling tickets for the Opportunity Quilt, or directing viewers where to place a bid for a Silent Auction item. Easy peasy stuff but we must have a volunteer there during all Museum open hours. Check those calendars and sign up with Betty Rinkle beginning at the April meeting.

*As a useful definition, according to Wikipedia:*

**"Out of the blue"** is an informal English language idiom that describes an event that occurs unexpectedly, without any warning or preparation. It is used as an adverb. The "blue" in the phrase [usually] refers to the sky, one from which a sudden thunderstorm is unexpected.

Please don't let this definition limit your creativity and ideas. The challenge is open to all quilters both our traditional quilters and our art quilters—new quilters, male quilters and experienced quilters. Entry must be made by a single individual. As always, keep your challenge a secret. ## The Jail Project - March Update by *Judy Rainbrook*

Donna Guy has worked through the kinks of transitioning from "Officer Guy" to just plain "Miss Guy" at the Leon County Jail. Her ladies are in full production mode, finishing 50 quilts (40" x 40") for the Shriners by end of March. She now has a full complement of worker bees.

We now have four volunteers that visit the jail quilting program at least once a month and one who visits twice a month. The jail ladies continue to be an inspiration to us because they produce quilts with only hand scissors and donated fabric and thread, they lay them out and sandwich them on the floor and often have no sewing experience before arriving at the program. We continue to be inspired by the joy and the pride in their work we see in these women.

In the coming months, the program will be focusing on quilts for the cancer floor at Tallahassee Memorial Hospital, making walker caddies for the Shriners and quilts for the Dialysis Center.

They continue to need thread. They get black and white thread from the jail but need most colors, especially off-white, beige, navy, yellow and pink.


## Sit-n-Stitch Groups
