WOW 2016. This is going to be a great year, with many activities. We have two quilt shows scheduled; City Hall opening in April (application form available soon, but we will let you know) and a show in the Museum of Florida History. There's a Challenge Quilt committee for the Museum Show and something new related to fundraising. The new Steering Committee is meeting on January 19th at 7 p.m. at Temple Israel and of course, all QU members are invited to attend.

Bring your guarters, dollars and fives 'cause there's a new Fundraiser in the Guild (but no new sheriff except me)!! Last year the Frayed Edges sit and stitch proposed a fundraising "Quilters' Treasure" idea to the Steering Committee that would work with our existing Door Prize committee, but be separately conducted. Here's how it's going to go: There will be tickets available for purchase for a super-duper basket of goodies every quarter. Tickets are \$1 for a single and 10 for \$5. Tickets will be sold for three guild meetings and on the 3rd meeting, a winner will be picked (e.g., tickets sold during January, February and March general meeting with the drawing as part of the March general meeting. At the end of the year, a percentage will be used as seed money for 2017 Quilters' Treasure, if the program is found successful. Remaining monies will go to the Guild general fund. This doesn't replace Lucy and her committee of Door Prizes, so wear your nametag and drop your name in the box and then buy tickets for the Treasure!



Leon County Jail Program

Our December visit found many of the jail ladies hard at work finishing up their personal quilts, as there were a number of women due to be released soon. All the jail ladies are allowed to make one personal quilt. We are glad for the women getting out, but feel for Officer Guy, who will now be training a new batch of "recruits."

I delivered FOUR boxes and several smaller bags of fabric to the jail that Michelle Hackmeyer and I had sorted out from a recent donation of two truckloads of fabric. Sew for Hope, the 4H Palmer-Monroe Teen Center Sewing Club, the Daughters of the American Revolution's Appalachian Mountain School Sewing Program and the Salvation Army sewing program all benefited from Michele's hard work and willingness to truck all that fabric to her home and make the space for volunteers to sort through it.

What the jail program needs now are:

- Tan and cream thread
- Large pieces of material that can be used for quilt backing

In January, the jail ladies will be looking to start next year's Christmas quilts, so they can use all of that fabric left over from your 2015 Christmas projects!

The prison project is still looking for a person to stay in touch with the women who come out of jail and are given sewing machines by Sew for Hope. This would be a phone resource only, no direct contact is required - to answer sewing questions, point them to resources, let Sew for Hope know if they need fabric, etc. If you are interested, please contact Judy Rainbrook or Peggy Clark and let us know.

GUIDELINES AND SCHEDULE

• Exhibit items must be made by members of Quilters Unlimited.

• Pieces shown in past City Hall exhibits are not eligible. City policy prohibits works containing nudity or religious subject matter.

• Entries can be functional and non-functional items such as quilts, wall-hangings, pillows, wearable pieces (jackets, vests), accessories, tote bags and soft sculptures.

• A hanging sleeve must be securely sewn on the back of entry, and a round hanging rod (not flat) with a screw eye at each end must be provided by the exhibitor. Make sure the hanging rod is proportional to your piece – not too light and not too heavy.

• A label containing the piece title and exhibitor's name must be sewn on the back or inside of each piece. Quilts must be submitted in a pillowcase with the submitter's name on it.

• Youth of Quilters Unlimited members may submit an entry in the show on a "space available" basis. Name of member and relationship to member must be on the entry form.

• The exhibit is open to photography and Quilters Unlimited or the Council on Culture and Arts may use the images of the entries at their discretion.

• All entries are covered by the City of Tallahassee insurance while in the gallery space. All artists will be asked to substantiate the declared value of work if a claim is made. An estimate of value will be required on the application.

• The exhibitor agrees to abide by these guidelines and accepts the decisions made by Quilters Unlimited representatives, and the Council on Culture and Arts (COCA) staff in regards to placement of the entries in the exhibit.

• Entries may not be picked up before the exhibit closes.

• The methods for electronically submitting an application will be posted on the Guild website, with an e-mail blast sent as to when that capability is "active". A limited number of paper application forms will be available at the Guild Meetings.

There will NOT be an evening Reception as has sometimes occurred in the past.
