You do not have to limit it to one star. You can put as many as you like. Feel free to think outside the box. (For example: Your dream could be about a bright sunny day at the beach and challenge yourself to put in a star or do you have a fantasy about a celebrity "star" and challenge yourself to incorporate a traditional star into your quilt). And don't forget to incorporate your NAVY blue somewhere.

KITTY QUILTS

I have been discussing the "Kitty Quilts" given to the Tallahassee-Leon County Animal Service Center (TLCASC) with the Volunteer Coordinator for the Center, Miss Walters Grayson. Walters is thrilled with the quilts for the kitties, to the point she would like to see several of them showcased like artwork, both to brighten up the adoption area, and to draw attention to them as sometimes the quilts don't get seen in the kennels with the kitties. She would like the public to be aware of how the quilts got in the kennels with the kitties!

Walters has asked if we could make two to four "representative" quilts made for the Center to display with information about Quilter's Unlimited next to it. That way, the public could make the connection when they see the quilts to understand how they came about and who they should contact should they want to become involved.

She did say that some visually don't "make sense" when they're hung vertically so suggested that some could be designed with that in mind. And if possible, for those that have an alphabet function on their sewing machines, perhaps have "TLCASC" sewn onto into it. [Note: Perhaps those of us that do have this capability could help out the quilt-makers that don't. I will be glad to help coordinate this aspect.] Thanks everyone. Karen Skinner

These unique pieces depict and mimic bark, moss, lichen, leaves and other flora, reminding us of nature's beauty and bounty.

Feb. - a red fabric

Mar. – a green fabric

Apr. – a pastel fabric

May – a landscape fabric

Jan. – a pet animal fabric

Feb. – a baby/nursery print

Mar. – a wild animal fabric

Apr. – a fruit or veggie fabric

May – a water or blue sky fabric

June – a fabric with dots June – shells, beach print, or sand-colored fabric

July – a yellow fabric July – a patriotic print

Aug. – a purple fabric Aug. – a school-themed print

Sept. – a striped fabric Sept. – a kids/children's print Oct. – an orange fabric Oct. – a manly print or plaid

Nov. – a batik fabric Nov. – a Fall fabric

Dec. – a black and white fabric Dec. – a Winter scene or Christmas fabric

Please choose a good, quilt-quality fabric. A one-yard cut will be ample for cutting out the required number of 8-1/2" squares, but you should not have to use the entire yard (no need to bring any extra squares). If you are unable to bring a month's fabric squares, but wish to have that month's squares, just bring the squares for the month you missed to the following meeting, and we should have the last month's squares available for you to take home. If you have any questions please call Cheryl Willis, or Elizabeth Hawker.

Make sure your gallon-size zip-lock is labeled with your name, group number, and the month that a particular fabric is due. If you find extra squares in a bag when you pick it up, it is probably from the last month, due to a person missing that meeting and bringing it in later; just add it to that month's squares when you get home.

QU Quilt Show at the Lemoyne Center for the Visual Arts August 2014

A new event for the display of our best quilts is happening in downtown Tallahassee this summer.

The Lemoyne Center for the Visual Arts was created 50 years ago to promote and display art in our community. Please get involved by entering your best creations for this show.

Applications will be available starting in February. If you can not attend a meeting, please contact Jeanne Brenner to have an application sent to you.

Because of space restrictions this show will be juried by a three person panel.

Give your quilt(s) the best chance to get in with **good photography**....

For each entry you will need one photo of the entire quilt and one close up/ detail photograph.

There is no charge for submitting an application...please enter several of your best!

There will is a hanging fee of \$5.00 per quilt, to help defray the expenses of the show.

Any style quilt is welcome.

A few antique quilts are needed for display to help celebrate the golden anniversary of the founding of the Lemoyne Center.

If you wish to sell your quilt at the show, it can be displayed with your price, including a 40% commission to Lemoyne...there is no pressure to do this. Just an opportunity.

Applications are due back by June 12, Thursday night QU meeting.

Notification to all entrants of their status by July 1.

Quilt turn in at Lemoyne on July 26, a Saturday morning.

Show opens Friday, August 1.

Opening night reception from 6 PM - 9 pm

Lemoyne is open Tuesday through Saturday from 10 am to 5 PM.

Closed Sundays and Mondays.

Quilt Show ends Saturday, August 30.

Quilt pick up on Monday, September 1. If this date is a problem for you, talk to Jeanne.

Quilts should have a sleeve and hanging board. This is a different system than the City Hall Quilt show. A flat board is needed, rather than a rod with eyehooks. The size of the support board is dependent on the size/ weight of your quilt.

Most quilts will be hung on the walls with nails through the ends of the board. Please make your sleeve about 2 inches narrower than the width of your guilt, to allow room for the hanging process.

Please plan on participating and visiting this show to celebrate the creativeness and tenaciousness of our guild members.
