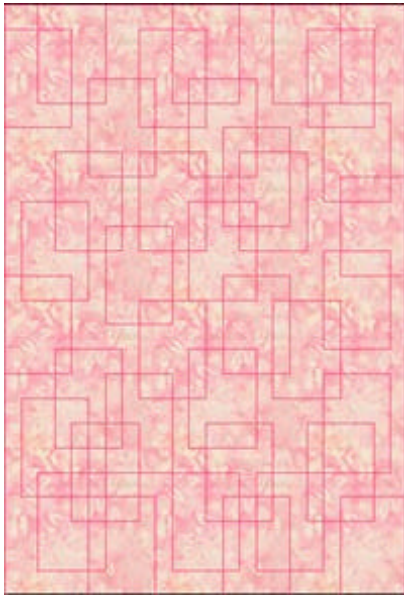


Neonatal Quilt Designs

Finished Size: 17" x 25"

Allover quilt designs:



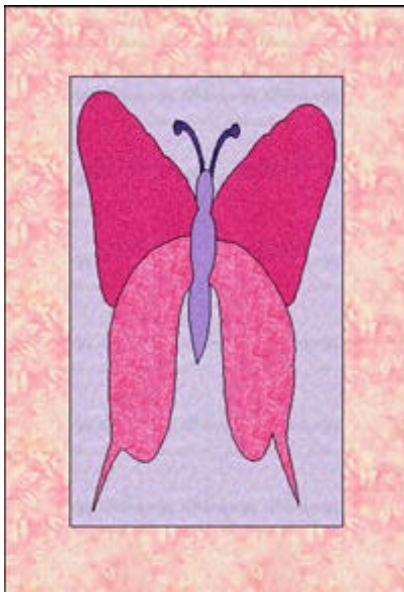
Design:

17 x 25 inch piece of fabric sandwich with batting and backing. Hand or machine quilt as desired. This could be a quick quilt to make with the meandering machine stitch.

Need:

17 x 25 inch print fabric for front
17 x 25 inch print or solid for back
17 x 25 inch batting
87 inches of binding

Machine Applique



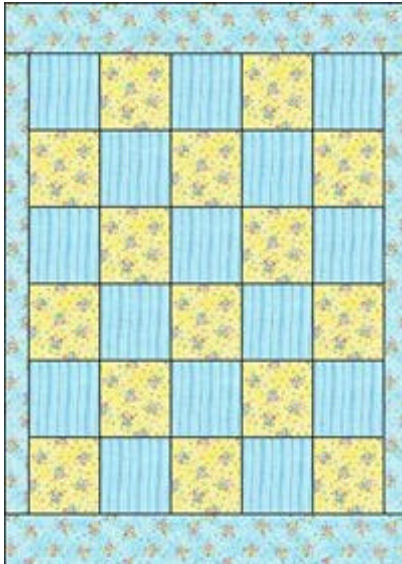
Design:

17 x 25 inch piece of fabric with machine appliquéd design. Machine appliqué is recommended for durability.

Need:

17 x 25 inch fabric
scraps as needed for desired appliqué design
17 x 25 inch fabric for backing
17 x 25 inch batting
87 inches of binding

Three inch units



Design:

35 (3 inch) squares with 1 inch border on each side and 2 inch border on top and bottom.

Need:

35 (3 ½ inch) squares

Use different prints or

Alternate 18 prints + 17 white

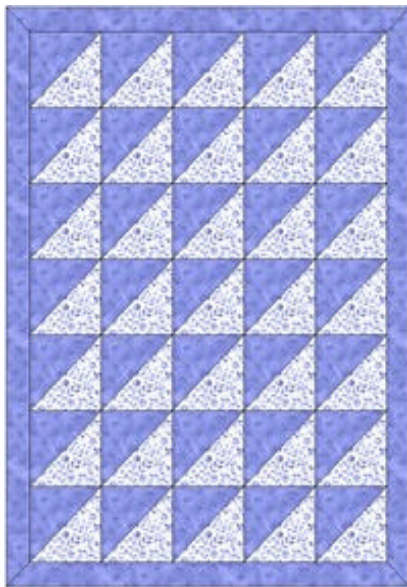
2 side border strips 1 ¼ in. wide x 23 long

2 top/bottom strips 2 ¼ in. wide x 19 long

Backing fabric 18 in. wide x 26 in. long

Batting 18 in. wide x 26 in. long

Binding: 87 inches



Design:

35 (3 inch) units made up of squares/triangles with 1 inch border on sides and 2 inch border at top and bottom

Need:

17 (3 ½ inch) squares

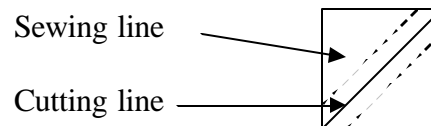
9 (3 7/8 inch) white squares

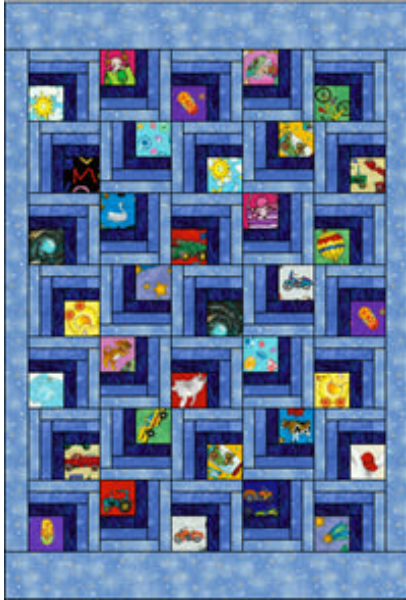
9 (3 7/8 inch) print squares

2 side border strips 1 ¼ in. wide x 23 long

2 top/bottom strips 2 ¼ in. wide x 19 long

With right sides together, lay one white square (3 7/8 inch) on top of one print square of the same size. Draw a diagonal line down the center of the square. Stitch ¼ inch on each side of the line. Cut along the line and you will have 2 triangle units that should measure 3 ½ inches square.





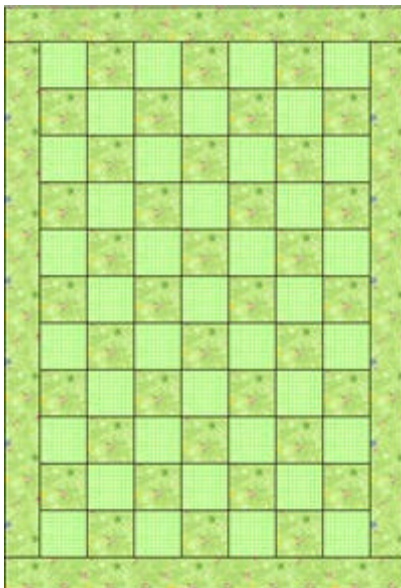
Design:

35 (3 inch) Dirty Windows units with
1 inch border on sides and 2 inch
border on top and bottom.

Need:

35 Dirty Window pattern pieces
(Use prints for arcs and white for
background)
2 side border strips 1 ¼ in. wide x 23 long
2 top/bottom strips 2 ¼ in. wide x 19 long

Two inch units



Design:

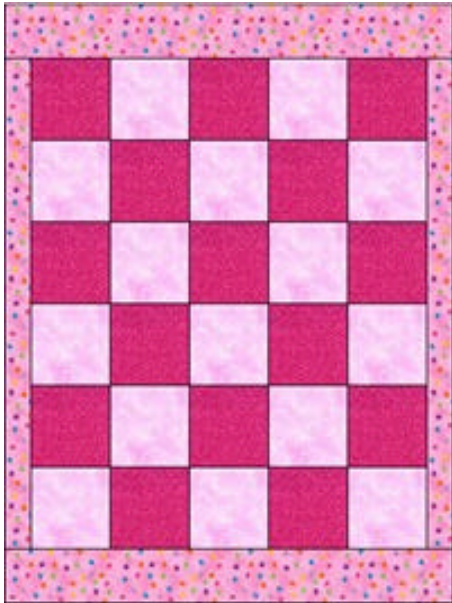
77 (2 inch) squares with 1 ½ inch
border on sides and 1 ½ inch border
on top and bottom.

Need:

39 (2 ½ inch) print squares
38 (2 ½ inch) white squares
2 side border strips (1 ¾ in. wide x 24 long)
2 top/bottom strips (1 ¾ in. wide x 19 long)

Note: If using the same print for all squares,
could use strip piecing.

Five inch units



Design:

12 (5 inch) squares with 1 inch side borders and 2 ½ inch top and bottom borders.

Need:

6 (5 ½ inch) print squares
6 (5 ½ inch) white or solid squares
2 side borders (1 ¼ in. x 21 long)
2 top/bottoms strips (2 ¾ in x 18 long)

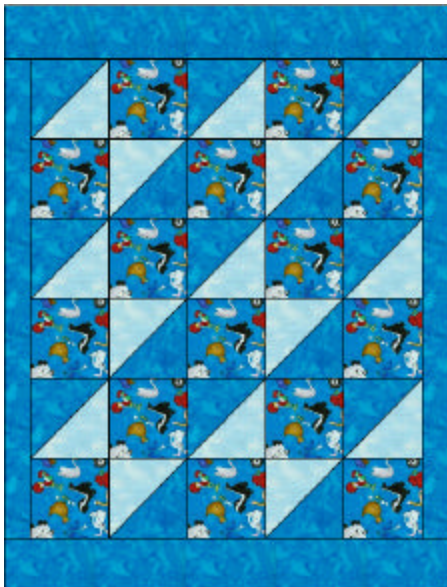
Design:

Five inch squares subdivided into triangle units with 1 inch side borders and 2 ½ inch top/bottom borders.

Need:

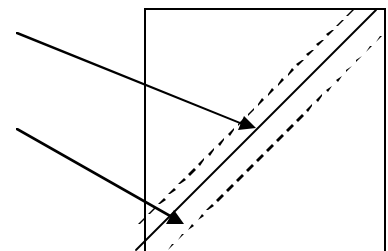
3 (5 7/8 inch) print squares
3 (5 7/8 inch) light squares
6 (5 ½ inch) white squares
2 side borders (1 ¼ in x 21 long)
2 top/bottom strips (2 ¾ in x 18 long)

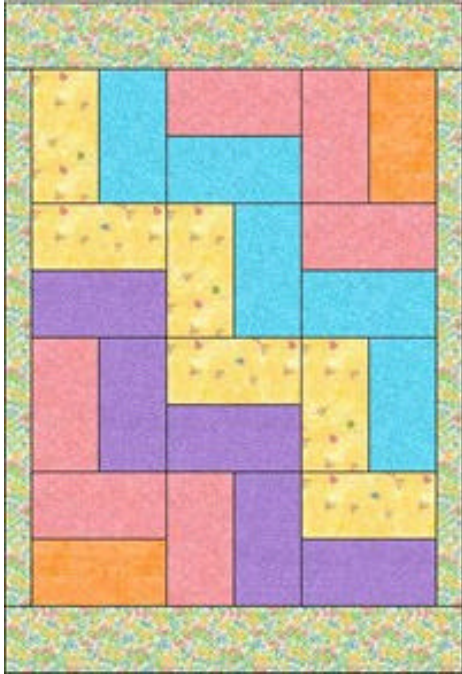
With right sides together, lay one print square (5 7/8 inches) on top of one white square (5 7/8 inches). Draw a diagonal line down the center. Stitch ¼ inch on each side of the line. Cut along the drawn line to yield 2 pieced triangle units. Repeat with remaining squares.

Rail Fence

Design:

Twelve 5 inch units made up of rectangles.
One inch side borders and 2 ½ inch top and bottom borders.

Need:

12 white or solid (3 inch x 5 ½) rectangles
12 print (3 inch x 5 ½ inch) rectangles
2 side borders (1 ¼ inches x 21 inches)
2 top/bottom borders (2 ¾ in. x 18)

Six inch center block



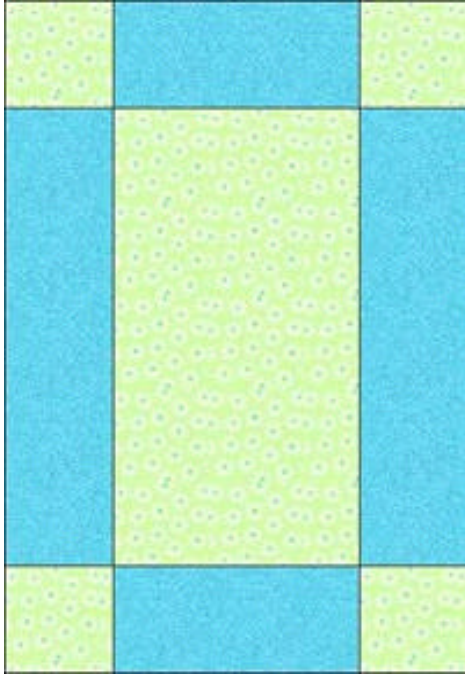
Design:

6 inch center block which could be pieced or solid, with three 2 inch borders. The top and bottom borders can be made into 2 inch x 4 inch rectangles or a 2 inch square checkerboard design.

Need:

1 (6 ½ inch) center square
2 print (2 ½ x 6 ½) strips
2 print (2 ½ x 10 ½) strips
4 solid (2 ½ x 10 ½) strips
4 print (2 ½ in. squares)
8 solid rectangles (2 ½ x 4 ½)
6 print rectangles (2 ½ x 4 ½)
2 side borders (1 ¾ x 24)
2 top/bottom border (1 ¾ x 27)

Large Center Rectangle



Design:

9 x 17 rectangle with 4 inch borders on all sides and 4 inch corner rectangles.

Need:

9 ½ inch wide x 17 ½ inch long rectangle

4 (4 ¼ inch) corner squares

2 (4 ¼ x 9 ½) top/bottom borders

2 (4 ¼ x 17 ½) side borders

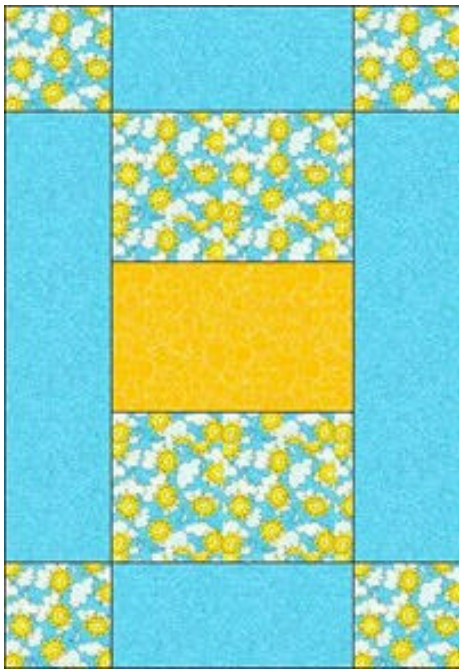
Alternate sizes:

11 x 19 inch rectangle with 3 inch borders

or

13 x 21 inch rectangle with 2 inch borders

Pieced Rectangle



Design:

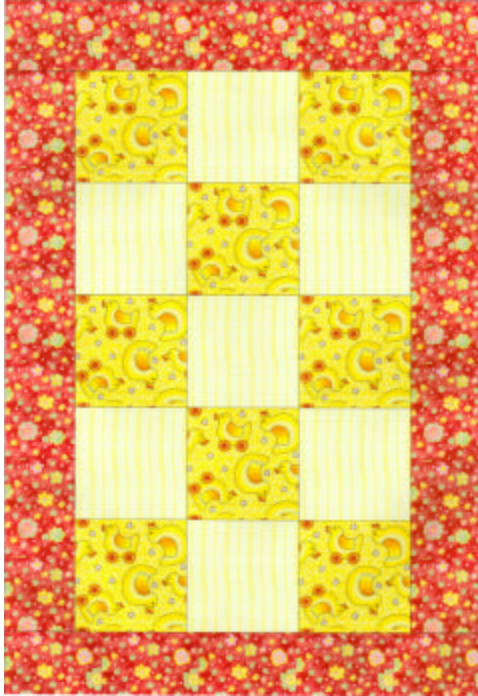
Three 13 inch wide x 7 inch long strips pieced to make a 13 x 21 center piece with 2 inch borders on all sides. This pattern works well with 3 different but coordinating prints or alternating prints with a white center strip. A quilted design or appliqué could be used in the center strip.

Need:

3 (13 ½ wide x 7 ½ long) rectangles

2 (2 ¼ x 21) side borders

2 (2 ¼ x 17) top/bottom borders



Here is another easy quilt for neonatal intensive care unit at tallahassee memorial hospital by Lorna Fisher

Here's a simple formula that you might want to use for this unusual size quilt. All measurements refer to FINISHED size:

- Make 15 blocks that will each finish to 4" square
- Sew the 4" blocks together into 5 rows with 3 blocks in each row (12" x 20" finished)
- Add 2 ½" borders to all 4 sides (17" x 25" finished)
- Quilt and bind
