Quilting (bent) safety pins, especially large size

Clear plastic 12 inch rulers

Call for Patriotic Star Blocks!

Frayed Edges has made several Quilts of Valor quilts using star blocks. These are very effective and fast. We'd love to have others participate in this rewarding project by making and donating star blocks.

Using 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square blocks, a patriotic lap quilt is usually 4 blocks wide by 5 blocks long. That means it takes 20 large blocks or a combination of large and small blocks to make a quilt.

Block Sizes: $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " or $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (includes $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance)

Star Colors: red, white, blue

Background Color: white or "white on white designs"





October Block

U. S. 1

U.S.1 was created by Marsha Walper, who she shared her technique of paper piecing at the August meeting. If you find that method too intimidating, simply add quarter inch seams and piece in the traditional method. Create your road with black and two shades of green on a light blue background. Bring your block to the October meeting and you just may win enough road blocks to reach from Maine to Key West!

WORKSHOPS

Lynne Hagmeier will be here in November!

Are you ready for some piecing? How about learning a new technique? What about having fun with old friends and meeting new ones? There's that and more at the Lynne Hagmeier workshops in November. Lynne sent me a copy of her latest book, "Layers of Love". It has the projects which we'll be making in the Friday and Saturday workshops. Seats are available for both workshops. Lynne also has fabric kits for both projects. The fabric Kierra's Kickin' It, the Friday workshop of half hexies is \$77.50. The fabric kit for 30-Something, the Saturday workshop is \$99.00. Let me know at the October Guild meeting or by phone or email prior to the meeting, if you want fabric kits. You'll pay Lynne at the workshops for the fabric kits, but MUST pre-order. For the Friday Kierra's Kickin' It, I think you'll need a 7-8" square piece of template material. Both of these workshops are appear suitable for scraps. You'll need both small and larger (fat 1/8 and fat ½) scraps.

You may need an extension cord. Bring a heavy duty one, not one you might use for a lamp or Christmas tree lights.

I'm looking forward to a great time and hope to see you at a workshop!

Workshops are held at Timberlane Church of Christ (where we have our Guild meetings) from 9 AM to 3 PM. Since the class begins at 9, please arrive with your sewing gear around 8:30 so you can be set up and ready to begin at 9 AM. It is suggested you brown bag lunch as lunch time can be brief. If you would like to bring a treat or good thing to eat and share with the group, these are always enjoyed, and appreciated. The Guild provides coffee in the morning.
