It's finally here. The bus trip to Jacksonville QuiltFest will take place Saturday, September 22, 2018. Here are some important things participants need to know:


***** There has been a LOCATION CHANGE!!!!****

- <u>Departing From</u> the <u>Walmart on Mahan/Hwy 90</u>. It is the Walmart that shares its parking lot with Costco and Bass Pro Shops. The actual physical address of the store is **4021 Lagniappe Way, Tallahassee**, **FL 32317** if you need it for a GPS. Please park in the back part of the parking lot. Here are **directions from I-10**:
 - o At **Exit 209A take ramp** for US-90 W toward Tallahassee (This is also Mahan Dr)
 - Once on Highway 90/Mahan Dr you will need to go about 4.2 miles. Cross the intersection at Buck Lake and you will see the Costco/Bass Pro/Walmart on the left
 - Turn LEFT onto Lagniappe Way (there should be a light here and it's just a service road that comes into the parking lot)
 - o Turn **Right** onto Sabine Dr (another interior road in the parking lot)
 - Take first RIGHT and parking will be on the Right
- <u>Time: Arrive by 7am to load and depart by 7:30am.</u> If everyone is on board by 7:30 we may get an earlier start :o)
- <u>Returning</u>: Departing Jacksonville at 3:00pm arriving back to Tallahassee at approximately 6:00pm

There will be activities on the bus such as word find puzzles, Where's Waldo type of activities and Bingo. You may want to bring a book or magazine to lean on.

There are still 9 seats left on the bus. If your plans have changed and you can now join us please see Christine Walsh at the September 13 Guild meeting. Fee for the trip is \$35.00 and that includes admission. Come join the fun.

Block of the Month - September

Although September 9th was "National Teddy Bear Day", we had other celebrations then; so here's the rest of the story: This holiday is for honoring and celebrating the best friend of most young children around the world... the huggable and cuddly teddy bear.

The name Teddy Bear comes from one of American President Theodore Roosevelt's hunting trips to Mississippi. There were several other hunters competing, and most of them had already shot something. A suite of Roosevelt's attendants, led by Holt Collier, cornered, clubbed, and tied to a willow tree an American Black Bear after a long exhausting chase with hounds. They called Roosevelt to the site and suggested he shoot it. He refused to shoot the bear himself, deeming this unsportsmanlike, but instructed that the bear be killed to put it out of its misery, and it became the topic of a political cartoon by Clifford Berryman in The Washington Post on November 16, 1902. While the initial cartoon of an adult black bear lassoed by a white handler and a disgusted Roosevelt had symbolic overtones, later issues of that and other Berryman cartoons made the bear smaller and cuter.

A Brooklyn store owner, Morris Michtom, saw the drawing of Roosevelt and the bear cub and was inspired to create a new toy. He created a little stuffed bear cub and put it in his shop window with a sign that read "Teddy's bear." The toys were an immediate success and Michtom founded the Ideal Novelty and Toy Co., which still exists today. http://www.gone-ta-pott.com/national_teddy_bear_day.html

So we give you "teddy bear" blocks: (pieced) Bear Paw, "B" for Bear (with optional free bear applique) and (applique) Ted E. Bear. Go wild, use any colors, especially scraps for details and embellishments. All blocks should be $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished, applique blocks on 13" (or greater) background.

Philanthropic Challenge

Are you up for our next Philanthropic Challenge? Fifty (yes 50) TMH Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) Quilts and Isolette covers!



The size range is anywhere from $15" \times 22"$ to $17" \times 25"$. Soothing colors are preferred, as stimulation needs to be kept at a minimum. The quilt fits on top of the sheet, with the baby placed on top of the quilt which explains why the size can vary. Quilt tops should be made of all cotton fabrics, including cotton flannels. Batting can be polyester or cotton; backing can also be polyester, like "Minky", or cotton fabrics.

Please machine quilt and bind them, keeping them free of other embellishment. Also, please put your name on a piece of paper and pin it to the quilt. We'd love to recognize each of you!

QU has been asked to donate at least 10 lap (60" x 72") size quilts, books, and pillowcase for the TMH Santa Day. Nothing larger than a lap size and general Christmas/Winter theme fabrics (does not need to be gender specific). Books do not need to be Christmas/winter theme.
