President's Message

Perhaps it's just the winter doldrums, but I've been in something of a creative slump lately. My sewing room closet contains a four-drawer dresser full of colorful prints, a 3'x2' bookcase stacked to overflowing with luscious batiks, solids and blenders, and four large plastic bins hiding "must have" yardage bought long ago, but none of it was providing any inspiration. And neither were my many quilting books or my binders of magazine clippings.

So one recent day I hauled out my scrap bin to see what might be chopped up for pet bed stuffing and discovered a stack of 1½" and 1½" strips of solids and tone-on-tone fabrics. What the heck, I said to myself, I'll just start sewing these together and see what happens. Before long I had enough strip sets to make six 8½" blocks. Wow, they were really unattractive, the sort of blocks that scream "what were you thinking"! However, after cutting them up into 2" wide strips I started getting the germ of an idea for a quilt, sort of a modified "Roman Coins" design. It may not win any ribbons when it's finished, but at least I'm over that slump and enjoying seeing what develops.

How do you pull yourself out of a sewing slump? There's inspiration all around if we look for it, and I'm not talking about Pinterest. Mother Nature never fails to provide design ideas, from the shapes and colors of an English garden, or of snowy mountain vistas, or a forest full of ferns, oaks and pines. Museums hold numerous treasures having elements you might work into a quilt: fragments of Roman tiles might suggest block or quilting designs; abstract paintings with surprisingly effective color combinations could inspire a departure from your usual color palette; designs etched into Pre-Columbian pottery, Norse symbols, and other goodies could wind up as elements as well. Or go to the library and dip into art books, into tomes of architectural wonders, even into geometry texts where you may just find some new shapes to build into a stunning block of your own design.

Get inspired, and get sewing!

Please note the guidelines that are set forth by COCA for this show, as listed on the webpage when entering. I will be collecting the quilts at our May meeting and will be returned at the August guild meeting.

As in the past for the City Hall show, a hanging sleeve and label must be securely sewn on the back of entry, and a round hanging rod (not flat) with a screw eye at each end must be provided by the exhibitor.

Block of the Month

Be a Star - Make the February Block of the Month!

At February's meeting, please turn in your finished **Brasstown Star Blocks** and don't forget to drop your name in the bag for a chance to win a quilt-y surprise.

Brasstown Star blocks will be used to create a quilt for the QU Silent Auction.

Please follow the directions to create your 12.5" unfinished block.

QU will be using the following colors for this block (think autumn colors, to match our quilt show theme):

Color 1 = Gold fabric – solid, tone on tone or small print (should read gold)

Color 2 = Brown fabric – solid, tone on tone or print (should read brown)

Color 3 = Cream or Beige fabric - solid, tone on tone or print (should read cream/beige)

March's Block is **Split Nine Patch #2** and we will be using these for a young boy's quilt for Sew for Hope.



Pattern is from Quilter's Cache -

Please follow the directions to create your 9.5" unfinished block.

QU will be using the following colors for this block (think young boy):

Color 1 = Black fabric – print is okay

Color 2 = Bold/Bright fabric - any color

Color 3 = Contrasting Bold/Bright fabric – any color

We will be alternating the blocks with "Monster Truck" blocks as seen here:



We will have a few printed copies of the pattern at the Block of the Month table for those without internet access.

Thank you to all our January flower makers! We have 16 blocks for a charity quilt – If you have a January block that was a late bloomer, last chance to bring it to the February meeting!

2019 UFO Completion Challenge

Entry Deadline April 11

The September guild program will feature quilters and their completed UFOs. Participants will receive a UFO-C3 (Completion Challenge Certificate).

There will also be certificates for individuals or groups completing the oldest UFO, the most complicated UFO, the most UFOs, the largest and smallest UFOs, the oldest UFO completed by someone other than the original maker, the most unique reason for the delay in completion, and the most deviation from the original plan.

This year's theme is "Autumn Reverie. The rules should suit any style. We hope the challenge gives you food for thought, sparks your imagination, and results in a quilt that is uniquely yours as you incorporate the required elements contained in the 2019 rules.

The challenge is open to traditional quilters and art quilters—new quilters and experienced quilters. Entry must be an original design and made by a single individual. As always, keep your challenge a secret.

To find out more about the challenge, you can purchase challenge rules for \$5.00 from Challenge Chairperson Barbara Hoagland, who will be sitting at the Challenge table before meetings.

At this time our challenge quilt reveal and voting is scheduled for the July or August 2019 guild meeting.

Then, you will learn how to create a dynamic composition. With Ellen's pointers on design you'll be guaranteed to make a masterpiece. Finally, you will learn a quick technique for facing and finishing your quilt with no hand sewing! Participants must be familiar with free motion quilting.



March 16: Double Reverse Appliqué. Fee = \$65 + \$5 kit fee
This raw edge appliqué technique is extremely accurate. Ellen's
tricks for staying organized will ensure that your class time is efficient,
productive, & free of frustration. You will finish the Apple in class and
make good progress toward the pear. You'll also learn detailed
information about making your own DRA pattern. Participants must
be familiar with free motion quilting.

Participants will create "reference" samples based on the given pattern. A full size pattern for the instructor's adaptation of techniques will be provided in the supplied kit.
