### President's Message

I'm going to tell you something shocking about myself. I talk to my quilts – and they talk back.

However, before y'all form an ad hoc committee of the guild to measure me for a straitjacket, let him or her who has never had a conversation with fabric, ruler, and rotary cutter cast the first thimble. Ha, I thought so; I'm not the only one, right?

This little quirk first came to my husband's attention several years ago when he asked me what I was going to call a quilt that was nearly complete. Without missing a stitch while whipping down the binding, I admitted that I wasn't sure, since the quilt had not yet told me its name. And he moved away from me just a little bit on the sofa.

I have found that each quilt which I make has a voice and a personality all its own. "I Spy" quilts, particular favorites of mine, are silly and often giggle. A quilt for a nephew who is a marine biologist featured appliqued sea turtles which he himself had drawn; this one was mystical and full of the whispers of the sea. NICU quilts are sleepy little things.

A quilt's voice and personality sometimes change while the quilter works through the whole process. It may decide that it wants to be bolder and asks for a dash of an unexpected color. Maybe it's tired of being completely linear and longs for some swirls. Listen to what it's telling you. You may find that the end results are something uniquely "you", with your own voice, and your own quilting personality.

I'll continue to talk to my quilts, and listen to what they have to say to me. And I hope you will listen to what your quilts have to say to you; they may be telling you that you have talents you never suspected!

### Block of the Month

#### March Block of the Month

At March's meeting, please turn in your finished **Split Nine Patch Blocks** and don't forget to drop your name in the bag for a chance to win a quilt-y surprise.

**Split Nine Patch #2 –** We will be using these for a young boy's quilt for Sew for Hope.



QU will be using the following colors for this block (think young boy): Color 1 = Black fabric – print is okay Color 2 = Bold/Bright fabric – any color Color 3 = Contrasting Bold/Bright fabric – any color

April's Block will be the Card Trick. We will create a charity quilt with these classic blocks.



QU will be using the following colors for this block: Color 1 = White fabric – solid or tone on tone Color 2 = Mint/Light Green fabric – solid, tone on tone or print Color 3 = Pink fabric - solid, tone on tone or print

March 15: Floral Improv. Fee = \$65

Want to Enhance your artistic skill while making a quick project? This class will accomplish both. First you will learn how to make a variety of flowers with no patterns. Then, you will learn how to create a dynamic composition. With Ellen's pointers on design you'll be guaranteed to make a masterpiece. Finally, you will learn a quick technique for facing and finishing your quilt with no hand sewing! Participants must be familiar with free motion quilting.

<u>March 16:</u> Double Reverse Appliqué. Fee = \$65 + \$5 kit fee

This raw edge appliqué technique is extremely accurate. Ellen's tricks for staying organized will ensure that your class time is efficient, productive, & free of frustration. You will finish the Apple in class and make good progress toward the pear. You'll also learn detailed information about making your own DRA pattern. Participants must be familiar with free motion quilting.
