# QU Library

**The QU Library is back in town!** I have taken on the Librarian's duties and have the entire library at my home on the East side of Tallahassee. If you want any books, please let me know. I will be happy to work out a meeting somewhere or you can come by my home to pick up requested books. Review the inventory list posted on our website. The list is published in the different orders, by title, by author, and by subject.

## New to our inventory

The following are a few books that we have recently acquired. They are not new publications, just new to us. If you come across newly published books that you think we should add, please let me know.

Affairs of the Heart, Appliqué Masterpiece, by Aie Rossmann, published in 2004 by AQC (American Quilter's Society). This book contains 36 block patterns and border pattern. The blocks are (to me, a novice appliquér) moderately intricate and include embroidery details. The technique used is templates and finger/needle-turn process. The patterns and fabric selections are beautiful.

**Bended Bias Appliqué** by Linda M Poole, published in 2004 by AQS. This book presents a method for adding bias tape to appliqué pieces and blocks. Includes instructions on making bias tape, 35 nature-inspired patterns and 6 frame patterns incorporating bias tape.

**Painless Borders** by Sally Schneider published int 1992. Yes, it's an old book. It does use rotary cutting, but does not employ paper piecing. Borders are produced as blocks sewn in rows as part of the top rather than long strips added after the whole top is assembled. If nothing else, it could be used for ideas as there are 16 whole quilt designs and plans along with 7 pages of border designs.

**Angle Play Block** by Margaret J Miller, published in 2005. This book uses half-rectangle triangles made from AnglePlay templates but also shows how to make the templates yourself. Very interesting intricate designs that look quite challenging.

**Celtic Style Floral Appliqué** by Scarlet Rose published in 1994. Another old, but interesting, book. Combines floral designs and Celtic scrollwork to produce interesting designs. The book has 6 quilt designs and patterns and numerous variation options.
