Call for Volunteers to Present Opportunity Quilt at Arts and Crafts Festivals this Fall

It is time to make a call for volunteers to help with the several festivals and fairs where we can display our beautiful applique Opportunity quilt. Along with selling the tickets to win the quilt, we will have an assortment of fun quilted items for sale to benefit the QU philanthropy efforts. Some are holiday themed, and some are more general in theme but fun and pretty.

Our first event is the **Havana Pumpkin Festival** on Saturday, October 8th. The hours to be filled are from 7:30 am until 6:00 pm, which includes time for setup and for breakdown. The event's live hours are from 9:30 am until 5:00 pm.

Set up includes erecting an awning tent, a table, a banner sign, a quilt stand, and unpacking the quilt and goods for sale. It would be ideal to have 3 or 4 people



for the beginning and ending shifts to manage the set up and breakdown tasks. I have made those two shifts slightly shorter since they are more labor intensive.

Otherwise, 2 people per shift should be sufficient, keeping in mind that Ann Gaber will be there for the full day. This way any one of us could step away to eat or check out the festival.

September 2022 Block of the Month – Frame It Up

September's block offers choices—a checkerboard frame around a big center square to showcase a large print (version 1) or a center of half-square triangles (version 2). I used one 10" Kaffe Fassett print square as "Square A" and a coordinating solid for "Square B," and Kona "Snow" for the background fabric.

Materials:

From the layer cake set or other print or solid fabrics:

- one 10" square print for the center (Square A)
- one 10" square print or solid for the frame (Square B)

From the background fabric:

- Enough fabric to make ten 2.5" squares
- Two 5" squares (only for version 2)

Cutting and assembly instructions for both versions:

Make Strips for the Frame:

- Cut ten 2.5" squares from Square B and ten 2.5" background fabric squares.
- Sew together the squares to make four strips—two 4 alternating square strips and

two 6 alternating square strips.

Cutting and assembly instructions for version 1:

- Trim the large print 10" square to 8.5" square.
- Sew a 4-square strip to each side of the large square. (Make sure a background fabric square is on the top on one side and on the bottom on the other side.)
- Sew a 6-square strip to the top and bottom (make sure to reverse the order on the top and bottom—see the finished block) Trim to 12.5" if needed



Cutting and assembly instructions for version 2:

- Cut two 5" squares from Square A
- Using these and the background fabric 5" squares make four 4.5" half square triangles. (Instructions in this video, sorry about the ads.)
- Sew these half-square triangles into an 8.5" square using your choice of design—diamond, pinwheel, whatever appeals to you.
- Sew the 2.5" square strips onto this square—see the instructions for version 1.

Volunteer of the Year Award

It is time to think about nominating an active member of Quilters Unlimited for the Volunteer of the Year Award. This award gives us a chance to say "Thank You" to an active member for generously contributing time and expertise to Quilters Unlimited.

In addition to basic contact information, the entry form has three sections to describe the nominee.

- 1. Examples of initiative and/or assuming responsibility & leadership in guild activities
- 2. Willingness to help with routine tasks and unexpected needs
- 3. Examples of encouraging member participation in guild-related, community activities

The Award Criteria below is online in the Policies and Procedures:

- 4. Committee Procedures for Nomination
 - a) The Awards Committee shall solicit nominations from active Quilters Unlimited members through forms, published on the guild's web site.
 - b) There shall be a nominator and a co-nominator and both shall complete and sign the Nomination Form.
 - c) The Awards Committee Chairperson shall not be a nominator or co-nominator. In the case of any tie votes, the Chairperson shall cast the deciding vote.
 - d) An Awards Committee member, nominated for an award, shall not participate in discussions or voting pertaining to that award.
 - e) The current President is not eligible for the Volunteer of the Year Award.
- 6. Volunteer of the Year Award Criteria.
 - a) The Volunteer of the Year Award will be given to a participating guild member, who: supports the goals and purposes of Quilters Unlimited by promoting knowledge of and interest in quilting and the art of quilting; shows initiative and/or assumes responsibility and leadership; is willing to help with routine tasks and unexpected needs; stimulates participation in guild activities and community-related activities; and gives unselfishly of their time and effort for the benefit of the guild.
 - b) The nominee may also: serve as officer or committee chairperson and demonstrates areas of expertise in guild (programs, writing, other).
 - c) The Volunteer of the Year Nomination Form is due to the Awards Committee Chairperson no later than October 1st of each year. The form is available on the QU website.

The nomination form can be completed and submitted on your computer or on paper and must have both a nominator and a co-nominator from the guild.

Nomination Forms for the Volunteer of the Year Award are due by October 1.

October – Favorite Scrap Blocks

We all have them. Some of us hoard them. A few may consider is a curse of quilting while others just say it comes with the territory. We are talking about scraps. There are many ways to use them in quilts ranging from quick strip piecing to more labor-intensive applique. We all need ideas to keep our piles and boxes from growing too large. Share your favorite quilt block when working with scraps. Bring a block or two to show or even a complete quilt.

November – "Happy Fall Y'all"

Nothing says fall quite like warm savory beverages, trees ablaze in color and a nip in the air (and let's not forget less humidity). Share your favorite fall-inspired quilt items that you made in the past. Using your fabric scraps, consider creating the Easy Maple Leaf Quilt Block Pattern and decorate your own reusable market shopping bag. Thanks to Sew 4 Hope for shifting some of their efforts from their main focus to SHP. I know there are many of you contributing in your own quiet ways. Deepest gratitude to all.

I want to speak to one of our newest efforts which is termed Fidget Quilts. Included in photos this month are three and last month six or seven and that many again in the month before. All of these have gone to the local Hospice office for distribution to the five counties they service. They feel these lap quilts provide a calming influence on patients with agitation or just nervous hands. More have been donated to Westminster Retirement Community's aging population with varying types of dementia. This is a new effort chaired by Carol Eskola who has been receiving donations of interesting things such as short zippers, big buttons, big beads, ribbons, laces, velcro, etc. enough to start a cottage industry. But she could use some help making the quilts!
