November 2022 Block of the Month – Mother's Favorite

I don't know who Mother is or why this is her favorite, but that is the name this block comes with at <u>allpeoplequilt.com</u>. I altered the pattern slightly to make it work with 10" squares. This 12.5" block has half-square triangle and flying geese blocks and uses two 10" Kaffe Fassett print squares for "Square A" and "Square B," and Kona "Snow" for the background fabric.



Materials:

From the layer cake set or other print or solid fabrics:

• two 10" squares, contrasting but complementary; one is Square A and the other is Square B

From the background fabric:

- one 2.5" WOF (width of fabric) strip
- one 3" x 18" strip

Cutting instructions:

Square A

- two 4 7/8" squares, and cut each in half diagonally (makes 4 triangles)
- two 3" squares
- two 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles
- two 1.5" x 4.5" rectangles

Square B


- four 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles
- eight 2.5" squares

Background Fabric

- nine 2.5" squares
- four 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles
- two 3" squares
- four 2 7/8" squares, cut in half diagonally (makes 8 triangles)

Assembly:

- Create the center by sewing 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles (Square A fabric) to either side of a background fabric 2.5" square. Sew 1.5" x 4.5" rectangles to the top and bottom of this unit, creating a 4.5" square.
- Corner Triangle Squares
 - Make four half-square triangle blocks using the 3" squares from Square A and the background fabric, using <u>this</u> method.
 Press the seam allowance toward the Square A fabric side and trim to 2.5".
 (Diagram 1)
 - Sew two background fabric 2 7/8" triangles to either side of each half-square triangle block to make four pieced large triangles. Press the seam allowances toward the background fabric. (Diagram 2)
 - Sew a pieced large triangle to each Square A fabric large 4 7/8" triangle. Press the seam allowance toward the Square A fabric and trim to 4.5" square, if necessary. (Diagram 3)
- Flying Geese Units
 - Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of the Square B 2.5" squares and the remaining 8 background fabric 2.5" squares.



- Create eight flying geese units with the 2.5" squares and 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles, using <u>this</u> method. There are four units with background fabric corners and four units with fabric B corners. (Diagrams 4 and 5)
- $_{\odot}$ $\,$ Sew flying geese units together as shown in Diagram 6.
- Assemble as shown in diagram 7, pressing seams in the upper and lower strips to the corner triangle squares and in the middle strip to the center square. Press horizontal seams away from the center.
- Trim block to 12.5" if needed.

A Quilt of Valor was awarded to Shirley Combass at her home in Tallahassee on October 9, 2022. Shirley served 27 years in the U.S. Army and activated National Guard Reserves from 1986-2013. She was a First Sergeant E8 upon exiting the army. Shirley's quilt was made by members of Quilter's Unlimited and quilted by Julie Fredrickson. Shirley is shown with her friend, Glen Keyes, holding her quilt.



Earl Harris was awarded a Quilt of Valor on Friday, October 14, 2022 at his home in Greenville, Fl. Mr. Harris was a U.S. Marine, then in the U.S. Army, and the Army National Guard. He served 22 years, retiring as First Sergeant E5. Among his postings were Russia, Hong Kong, Somalia, Alaska, Saudi Arabia, and Iraq.
