- If you rent half of a table, please bring something (painters' tape, a ping pong net, etc.) to subdivide the table.
- On the night of the Swap Meet you can come into the meeting space at 5:45 to set up your items.
- Please bring a sheet or something to cover up the merchandise until the business segment of the meeting is completed.
- There will be no sales until the Swap Meet begins.
- Sellers are responsible for making change for their sales.
- All items that are not sold must be removed from the meeting space at the end of the evening.

For 2023, we will create blocks to strengthen or reinforce piecing skills using shapes and techniques of most quilt block patterns. It's as easy as BOM-2-3.

Please bring your March Rail Fence and/or Roman Coins blocks to display at the meeting and enter your name for a chance to win a prize.

If you prefer to participate and make blocks for charity, please use red, white and blue fabrics.

April's theme is Tube Piecing and patterns are below and on the guild website with more details.

April Block of the Month

April's Theme – Tube Piecing - Additional photos of each step are on the QU website under Block of the Month

Starting Point Block: Spool – 12" Block – 3 Colors



Fabric Needed:

Color 1 = Cut 1 - 5" x width of fabric strip Background & Color 2 = Cut 1 - 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " width of fabric strip

Directions:

Step One: Sew the Color 2 and Background strips together. Press towards Color 2 strip. This unit should now measure 5" wide.

Step Two: Lay the Color 1 strip on top of the Color 2/Background unit and sew on both edges to form a

tube. (It helps to sew these long seams in opposite directions to keep from stretching your fabric in one direction.) Press the tube to make sure it lays flat.

Step Three: Lay the tube lengthwise on your cutting mat with Color 1 side up. Using

the corner of a 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square ruler (or larger), align both of the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " marks on the bottom stitching line, making sure to have enough room past your selvage. Note – the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " marks are NOT aligned with the edge of the fabric, but with your stitching.

Step Four: Cut along the side of the ruler to remove the selvage edge.

Step Five: Turn over your tube so the Color 2/Background side is up. Realign your ruler with the 6 ½" marks on the bottom seam and fabric's cut edge aligned with the edge of the ruler. Cut along the fabric side of the ruler. You should now have one cut triangle unit.

Step Six: Repeat the process, flipping and turning the tube so the cut edge is always aligned with the edge of the ruler opposite your rotary cutting hand. Remember to align the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " marks on the ruler to the stitching line. Cut until you have 4 triangle units (you won't need to cut the whole tube). Two should be from opposite sides of the tube.

Step Seven: Open up your triangle units gently undoing the stitch at the point if needed. Press the seam towards Color 1 on the units with the Background next to Color 1 and press towards Color 2 on the opposite units. Units should measure 6 ½" square.

Next Level Block: Striped Square – 12" Block – 4 Colors



<u>Fabric Needed</u>:

Color 1 = Cut 1 – $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x width of fabric strip and Cut 1 – $1\frac{5}{8}$ " width of fabric strip

Colors 2 & 3 = Cut 1 – 1 5/8" width of fabric strip Background = Cut 3 – 1 5/8" x width of fabric strips

Directions:

Step One: Sew the Color 1, 2 and 3 1 5/8" strips to a Background 1 5/8" strip. Press towards to Color strip. These units should now measure 2 3/4" wide.

Step Two: Sew the Background/Color 1 unit to the Background/Color2 unit with the background strips alternating with the color strips. (It helps to sew these long seams in opposite directions to keep from stretching your fabric in one direction.) Press towards Color 2. Unit should measure 5" wide.

Step Three: Sew the Background/Color 3 strip to the Color 1 2 3/4" strip. Press towards Color 1. Unit should measure 5" wide.

Step Four: Lay the 3 strip unit on top of the 4 strip unit and sew on both edges to form a tube. (The Color 1 strips should be together.) Press the tube to make sure it lays flat.

Step Five: Lay the tube lengthwise on your cutting mat with 3 strip side facing up and the Color 1 strip at the top. Using the corner of a $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " square ruler (or larger), align both of the $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " marks on the bottom stitching line, making sure to have enough

room past your selvage. Note – the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " marks are NOT aligned with the edge of the fabric, but with your stitching.

Step Six: Cut along the side of the ruler to remove the selvage edge.


Step Seven: Turn over your tube so the 4 strip side is up. Realign your ruler with the 6 ½" marks on the bottom seam and fabric's cut edge aligned with the edge of the ruler. Cut along the fabric side of the ruler. You should now have one cut triangle unit.

Step Eight: Repeat the process, flipping and turning the tube so the cut edge is always aligned with the edge of the ruler opposite your rotary cutting hand. Remember to align the 6 ½" marks on the ruler to the stitching line. Cut until you have 4 triangle units with the Color 1 at the triangle points. (You will get 3 triangle units with Color 1 at the base of the triangle. These will not be used for the block.)

Step Nine: Open up your triangle units gently undoing the stitch at the point if needed. Press towards Color 3. Units should measure 6 ½" square.

Step Ten: Align the 2 units with the wider Color 1 to the top left. Align the 2 units with the wider Color 1 to the top right. Sew together and press both units in same direction.

Step Eleven: Rotate one unit 180 degrees so Color 1 is on the bottom outside corners and sew together. Press in one direction.
