
April Program



Valerie Goodwin

Valerie Goodwin will speak at the April 13 meeting. She is a local mixed media fiber artist and architect whose works of fine art are included in museum and private collections. Most of her work is inspired by a love of aerial views of landscapes and cities. Many of her quilts are based on maps. She will present MAPPING NARRATIVES USING FABRIC, PAINT & THREAD, a lecture about how she uses maps to tell the story of a place using fabric, paint, and thread. The focus will be on 3 types of maps: Personal Narrative Maps, Fictional Map Narratives and Political/Sociological Narratives.

May: Another meeting you won't want to miss—Sheila Callahan will present a trunk show and lecture with novel ideas for those tiny bits of fabric that seem too small to use but are too precious to toss.

June: The big reveal of challenge quilts! Have your quilt ready to show or come and be awed by what your fellow guild members can create!

July: Quilts of Valor will be the topic for July. We will learn about the Quilts of Valor program and the story of a recent local recipient of one of these quilts.

It is time to think about nominating an active member of Quilters Unlimited for the Distinguished Quilter Award

Nominations for Distinguished Quilter are due by June 1. Nomination forms for Distinguished Quilter are online at: https://quilttallahassee.com/activities-and-projects/awards/ The nomination form can be completed and submitted on your computer or on paper and must have both a nominator and a co-nominator from the guild.

In addition to basic contact information, the entry form has three sections to describe the nominee.

- 1. Outstanding quilting expertise and talent
- 2. Quilting demonstrations, teaching and/or writing by quilter
- 3. Local, regional, and/or national quilt shows entered; awards received

The Award Criteria below is online in the Policies and Procedures:

- 4. Committee Procedures for Nomination
 - a) The Awards Committee shall solicit nominations from active Quilters Unlimited members through forms, published on the guild's web site.
 - b) There shall be a nominator and a co-nominator, and both shall complete and sign the Nomination Form.
 - c) The Awards Committee Chairperson shall not be a nominator or co-nominator. In the case of any tie votes, the Chairperson shall cast the deciding vote.
 - d) An Awards Committee member, nominated for an award, shall not participate in discussions or voting pertaining to that award.
 - e) The current President is not eligible for the Volunteer of the Year Award.
- 5. Distinguished Ouilter Award Criteria
 - a) The Distinguished Quilter Award will be given to a participating guild member, who: supports the goals and purposes of Quilters Unlimited by promoting knowledge of and interest in quilting and the art of quilting; has outstanding quilting expertise and talent; shares by demonstrations, teaching, or writing; and enters quilts in local, regional, and national quilt shows.
 - b) The nominee may also: serve as an officer or committee chairperson, demonstrate areas of expertise in guild (programs, writing, other), and show initiative and/or assume responsibility.
 - c) The Distinguished Quilter Nomination Form is due to the Awards Committee Chairperson no later than June 1st of each year. The form is available on the QU website.

The 2023 Block of the Month...It's as Easy as BOM-2-3

For 2023, we will create blocks to strengthen or reinforce piecing skills using shapes and techniques of most quilt block patterns. It's as easy as BOM-2-3.

Please bring your April Spool and/or Striped Square blocks to display at the meeting and enter your name for a chance to win a prize.

In the first three months of 2023, we have created 49 blocks for veteran quilts. Thank you to everyone who has made a block or blocks!

May's theme is Half Square Triangles and patterns are below and on the guild website with more details.

If you prefer to participate and make blocks for charity, please use red, white and blue fabrics.

May Block of the Month

May's Theme – Half Square Triangles - Additional photos of each step are on the QU website under Block of the Month

Starting Point Block: Pinwheels – 12" Block – 3 Colors



Half Square Triangles – Two at a Time Fabric Needed: Background = Cut 8 – 3 7/8" squares Color 1 & Color 2 = Cut 4 – 3 7/8" squares

Directions:

Step One: On the wrong side of the Background 3 7/8" squares, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. (This will be a cutting line, so you can use a permanent fabric pen.)

Step Two: Place a Background square and Color 1 square right sides together. Sew a scant 1/4" from

the drawn diagonal line. Repeat on the other side of the diagonal line. (Make sure you are sewing a scant ¼". Check this by measure from the drawn line to you stitching line.) Press the squares to make sure they lay flat.

Step Three: Repeat Step Two with the Background and Color 2 squares.

Step Four: Cut all 8 squares along the drawn line using either scissors or rotary cutter and ruler. Carefully, press open towards Color 1 or Color 2. This is a half square

triangle unit measuring 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". You can clip off the dog ears on your HST units or leave them.

Step Five: Layout your HST units to create the Pinwheels pattern in rows, placing pieces from left to right.

Row 1 - Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the bottom left; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the top left; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the bottom left; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the top left.

Row 2 - Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the bottom right; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the top right; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the bottom right; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the top right.

Row 3 - Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the bottom left; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the top left; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the bottom left; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the top left.

Row 4 - Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the bottom right; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the top right; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the bottom right; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the top right.

This is the layout for this Pinwheels block. To reduce seam bulk, the block will be pieced together in rows, instead of piecing the four 6 ½" pinwheel blocks separately.

Step Six: Sew together the units in row one, making sure to keep the layout correct. Press seams to the left.

Step Seven: Repeat Step Six with rows 2-4, but press rows 2 & 4 to the right.

Step Eight: Sew the rows together keeping the layout and press seams in one direction.

Next Level Block: Starshine – 12" Block – 3 Colors



Block name and layout from <u>Blossom Heart Quilts</u> Half Square Triangles – Eight at a Time Fabric Needed:

Background = Cut $2 - 7 \frac{3}{4}$ " squares Color 1 & Color 2 = Cut $1 - 7 \frac{3}{4}$ " square

Directions:

Step One: On the wrong side of the Background 7 3/4" squares, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. Repeat, going from the opposite corners to form an "X". (This will be a cutting line, so you can use a permanent fabric pen.)

Step Two: Place one Background square and Color 1 square right sides together. Sew

a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " from one drawn diagonal line. Repeat on the other side of the diagonal line. (Make sure you are sewing a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Check this by measure from the drawn line to you stitching line.) Sew a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side of the other drawn diagonal line. Press the square to make sure it lays flat.

Step Three: Repeat Step Two with the other Background square and Color 2 square.

Step Four: Cut along the drawn line using either scissors or rotary cutter and ruler. Carefully, press open towards Color 1 or Color 2. This is a half square triangle unit measuring $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". You can clip off the dog ears on your HST units or leave them.

Step Five: Lay out your HST units to create rows A and B, placing from left to right. Layout two rows of each A and B.

Row A - Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the bottom right; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the top right; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the bottom left.

Row B - Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the bottom left; Color 2 HST with the background triangle at the top left; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the top right; Color 1 HST with the background triangle at the bottom right.

Step Six: Sew together the units in row A, making sure to keep the layout correct. Press seams to the left.

Step Seven: Sew together the units in row B, making sure to keep the layout correct. Press seams to the right.

Step Eight: Sew the rows A& B together and press in one direction.

Step Nine: Rotate one unit 180 degrees and sew two units together to form the block.

Philanthropy Report - April showers bring May flowers. And my oh my how Time flies!

We have kits made up to give out at the next QU meeting, April 13th. Please come by the Philanthropy table and take one or two. Many of them are to be sewn in the Quilt-as-you-go method and thus are very easy to manage with a standard sewing machine.

We will also have some quilt sandwiches (pieced top, batting, and backing fabric) to be basted as you wish, and machine quilted. Check the dimensions to be sure it is manageable for your type of machine. Several members have offered to bind so you could hand off a quilted sandwich and have time possibly to quilt another.

We have also received a very nice donation of quilt pre-cuts: jelly rolls and charm packs as well as more detailed design pre-cut kits. Some are large enough that they could be divided into two or three smaller quilts. You are welcome to any of these on the condition they be made into quilts for charity. Please speak to Jeanne Brenner if

you are interested in one of these.

Here are figures for the first quarter of 2023 of quilts completed by various individuals, teams, or bees. And I know there are many more donated directly.

<u>January 2023</u>: 16 to Sleep in Heavenly Peace, 3 to Big Bend Hospice plus 6 pillowcases, and 4 to TMH NICU (Neonatal intensive Care Unit).

February 2023: 20 to Sleep in Heavenly Peace and 6 to TMH NICU.

<u>March 2023</u>: 47 to Sleep in Heavenly Peace, 1 to Hope Mission, 4 to TMH NICU, 2 to Big Bend Hospice, and 1 to Laptops for Veterans.
