## August Block of the Month

August's Theme – Flying Geese



<u>Starting Point Block</u>: Dutchman's Puzzle – 12" Block – 3 Colors (Flip Method/One at a Time) Fabric Needed:

Background = Cut 16 –  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

Color 1 and Color 2 = Cut  $4 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles <u>Directions</u>:

Step One: On the wrong side of the Background 3 1/2" squares, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. (This will be your sewing line, so do not use permanent pen).

Step Two: Place a Background  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square in lower right corner of Color  $1.3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, right sides together with diagonal line going top left to

bottom right and align fabric edges. Stitch on diagonal line (ideally stitch just to the outside of the drawn line to allow for pressing fabric.) Before pressing, clip the corner seam allowance, leaving only 1/4" (use ruler and rotary cutter or scissors).

Press towards Background fabric. Unit should still measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Step Three: Repeat Step Two with remaining Color 1 rectangles and Color 2 rectangles.

Step Four: Place a Background 3 1/2" square in lower left corner of Color 1 rectangle

Box 12181, Tallahassee, FL 32317 unit, right sides together with diagonal line going top right to bottom left and align fabric edges. Stitch on diagonal line. Before pressing, clip the corner seam allowance, leaving only  $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press towards Background fabric. Unit should still measure 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". This is now a flying geese block.

Step Five: Repeat Step Four with remaining Color 1 units and Color 2 units.

Step Six: Align all the geese units with the geese pointing to the right. Place Color 1 unit to the right of Color 2 unit and sew the two units together. Make sure your point of the flying geese block is not in your seam allowance. Press towards the Color 1 unit. 2-geese unit should measure 6 1/2" square.

Step Seven: Repeat with remaining geese units in same alignment, for total of four 2geese units.

Step Eight: Align one 2-geese unit with geese point up. To the right, align another 2-geese unit with the geese pointing to the right. Sew units together and press towards the Color 2 unit. Repeat with remaining two 2-geese units. Finished unit should measure  $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

Step Nine: Align 4-geese units with geese point up and to the right, one unit below the other. Rotate the bottom unit 180 degrees so the geese point to the left and down. Sew units together and press up. The Dutchman's Puzzle block should measure  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " square.



<u>Next Level Block</u>: Friendly Geese – 10" Block\* – 4 Colors (No Waste/Four at a Time) Quilt block design from A Quilting Life <u>https://www.aquiltinglife.com/tips-for-flying-geese-blocks/</u> <u>Fabric Needed</u>: Background = Cut 1 – 2 ½" square and 12 – 2 7/8" squares Color 1, Color 2 & Color 3 = Cut 1 – 5 ¼" square <u>Directions</u>: Step One: On the wrong side of the Background 2 7/8" squares, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. (This will be a

Step Two: On a Color 1 square, place a Background 2 7/8" square in upper right corner and a Background 2 7/8" square in lower left corner, right sides together with drawn diagonal lines going from top right to bottom left. The corners of the Background squares will overlap in the center of the Color 1 square. Make sure the drawn diagonal line is aligned over the two squares to form one long line. Sew a scant 1/4" from the drawn diagonal line. Repeat on the other side of the diagonal line. (Make sure you are sewing a scant 1/4". Check this by measure from the drawn line to

cutting line).

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stitching line.) Press the squares to make sure they lay flat.

Step Three: Cut along the drawn line using either scissors or rotary cutter and ruler. Carefully, press open towards Background fabric. The two units now are a Color 1 half square triangle with two smaller Background half square triangles.

Step Four: Repeat Steps Two and Three with the Color 2 and Color 3 squares.

Step Five: On a Color 1 unit, place a Background 2 7/8" square in HST corner, right sides together with drawn diagonal line going from HST corner to between the Background two HSTs. The corners of the Background square will overlap the Background HSTs. Sew a scant 1/4" from the drawn diagonal line. Repeat on the other side of the diagonal line. Press the squares to make sure they lay flat.

Step Six: Cut along the drawn line. Carefully, press open towards Background fabric. Each unit is a Color 1 flying geese unit measuring  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". (If desired, trim off dog ears.)

Step Seven: Repeat Steps Five and Six for remaining Color 1, Color 2 and Color 3 units, resulting in 12 flying geese units (4 each).

Step Eight: Align a Color 1 flying geese unit horizontally and pointing down. Place the Background 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " to the right of the Color 1 unit and sew together. Press towards Background square.

Step Nine: Align the Color 1/Background unit with Color 1 on left and pointing down. Place a Color 1 flying geese unit to the right with the point up and sew together. Press towards Background square. Unit should measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ ". This is the center row of your Friendly Geese block.

Step Ten: Align a Color 3 and Color 2 flying geese unit with geese pointing to the left and Color 2 unit to the right of Color 3 unit. Sew the two units together along the 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " side. Make sure your point of the flying geese is not in your seam allowance. Press towards Color 3. Repeat for remaining Color 2 and Color 3 flying geese units. Units should measure 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Step Eleven: Align a Color 1 flying geese unit to the right of the Color3/Color 2 geese unit with all points to the left. Sew together and press towards Color 2. Repeat with remaining Color 1 flying geese unit. Units should measure  $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

Step Twelve: Align a 3-geese unit pointing left and place a 2-geese unit to the right of it, pointing up. Sew units together and press towards 3-geese unit. Repeat with remaining 3-geese and 2-geese unit. Units should measure  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". This is the top (geese point left and up) and bottom (rotate so geese point down and right) rows of your Friendly Geese block.

Step Thirteen: Sew rows together and press in one direction. Block should measure 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

\*Note: This block is based on math divsible by 5, so does not easily calculate for a 12" finished block. It is presented for a 10" finished block.

If you want a 12" finished block, add  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips around the block.

Alternately, to create a 12" finished pieced block, cut the Background 12 – 3 5/16" squares and 1 – 2 15/16" square and the Color 1-3 cut 1 – 6 1/8" square; however, the block with be slightly off-size from 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

#### **Upcoming Programs**

August: Soldier Quilts—Quilts made by soldiers in the 18th and 19th centuries. You will be awed by the artistry and craftsmanship in these quilts created from heavy woolen uniform fabric and ornamented with beads, braid, and buttons.

September: Debbie Sutherland from Bernina will talk to us about color—how she makes decisions about what fabrics to carry in her shop, how she advises customers who ask for help in choosing colors, and how color trends evolve in the quilt fabric industry.
