Henry Lowery of Tallahassee was awarded a Quilt of Valor on September 11, 2023 at his home. Henry served 33 years in the U.S. Marine Corps and retired as a Chief Warrant Officer 5. He did two tours in Vietnam and also served in Beirut and Grenada. Among his many awards are a Legion of Merit, two Navy commendations, and the Vietnam Cross for Gallantry with Palm. 
